Throughout the Psalm, David gives different reasons for praising God. He talks about who God is, how he loves us, has shown us mercy, how powerful he is – and lots more!



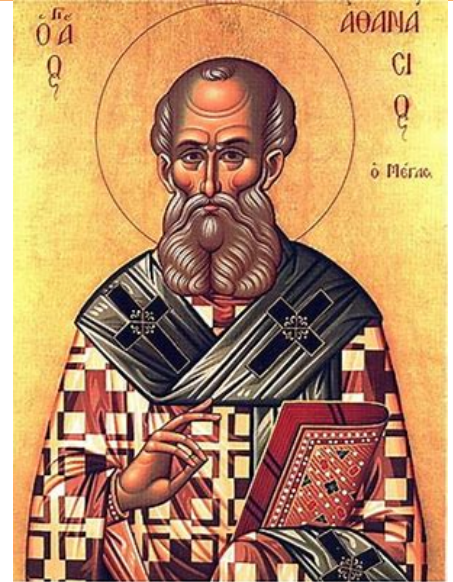


Wednesday - Church History



Last Sunday was the 2nd of May. On the 2nd of May in the year 373, a man called Athanasius died. Athanasius was born and grew up in the city of Alexandria in the part of Egypt controlled by the Romans.

Athanasius was a theologian – do you know what a theologian is? A theologian is someone who studies the Bible in order to learn lots of things about God and the Christian faith, and then teach these things to others. Even though Athanasius lived hundreds and hundreds of years ago, a lot of what we know and believe about God was written about by Athanasius and his friends!



Even when Athanasius was only little, he loved going to church and learning about God. He worked really hard at his lessons so that he could learn more and more! When he was still quite young, Athanasius became the apprentice of the local Bishop. This Bishop saw how smart Athanasius was and how much he loved God. The Bishop taught Athanasius lots of things and encouraged him to keep studying the Bible to see what God through the Holy Spirit would reveal to him.

Over time, Athanasius started to learn more and more things about God. He wrote all of these things down in books so he could share these things with other people. He knew that people needed to understand what they believed, otherwise false teachers might trick them into believing lies! Because of this, Athanasius was part of a large group of theologians who met in a town called Nicaea in 325. They decided to write a list of things Christians believed that could be taught to Christians across the world to stop them believing lies about God. This became known as the Nicene Creed and is still used in churches across the world! Here's how it starts:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, one in Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven and became man. By the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered, died, and was buried. On the third day he rose again in fulfilment of the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

Thursday: The World

Friday Craft Lesson

The next person we're learning about in the Hebrews Hall of Faith is Noah! What do you know about Noah?

But Noah isn't in the Hall of Faith because he built a reallllyyy big boat. Here's what the author of Hebrews writes:

"It was by faith Noah heard God's warnings about things that he could not yet see. He obeyed God and built a large boat to save his family. By his faith, Noah showed that the world was wrong. And he became one of those who are made right with God through faith." Hebrews 11:7

Noah is in the Hebrews Hall of Faith because... he had faith in God!

He showed this faith by hearing God's warnings (listening to God) and by obeying God (building the big boat just like God told him too!). Even though the people around him thought he was silly for thinking a big flood was going to come, Noah had faith in God and did what God told him to do.

Then, when the flood did come, Noah showed the world that they had been wrong, and God had been right!

Because Noah had faith in God, he was made right with God!
