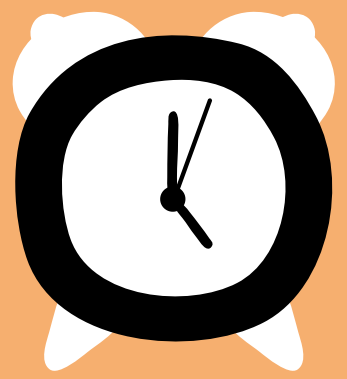

Wednesday - Church History



Today is the 352nd birthday of Susanna Wesley. She was born on the 20th of January 1669 and she was the youngest of 25 children! Susanna grew up going to church every Sunday and learnt when she was little to trust God

When Susanna was older, she got married and had lots of children. But things weren't easy for Susannah. Her husband wasn't around all the time and so Susannah had to manage everything to do with the family on her own. Their home burnt down twice, her children were often ill, and they never seemed to have enough money.



On top of this it was Susannah's job to teach her children as they didn't go to school. Even though things were really tough for the family, Susannah made sure she spent time with God every day and when her children were older, she wrote different things to help them do the same. Her children used these to help them understand things like the Ten Commandments and the Lord's Prayer.

Susannah felt like it was her responsibility to teach her children about God and she took that role very seriously. But Susannah didn't stop there. For a while there was no good preacher near the town where they lived, so Susannah would gather her family and they would recreate their own church services with Susannah reading from a book of sermons written by her husband or father. After a while, other people from the town wanted to join. Susannah knew that it was important that they heard about God and so she welcomed everyone to their family services. It turned out that lots of people wanted to hear about God and soon nearly 200 people were coming to the family's services! Thanks to Susannah's care for her family and her neighbours, all of them got to carry on learning and praising God!



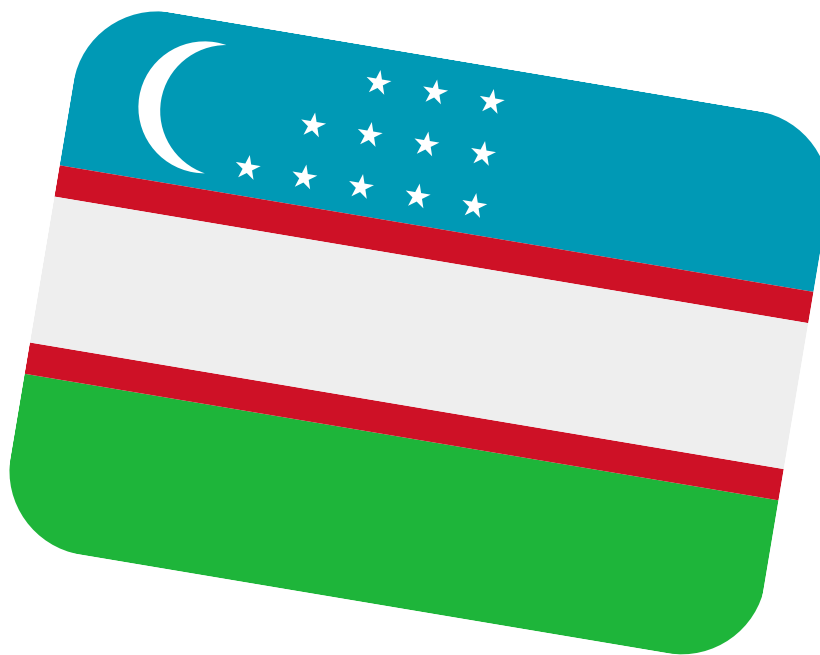
Thursday: The World
